PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to define who can participate in "CFS Activities" and the application process for non-member participants.

DEFINITIONS/RELATED POLICY

- "CFS" is Cornerstone Family Schools
- "CFS Activities" are those activities expressly sanctioned by the Board.
- "Homeschool Student" as defined in the CFS Purpose Statement (G-002)

BACKGROUND

The Board encourages CFS members to engage non-CFS members to advance the educational and extracurricular experiences of all children in the Kansas homeschool community. However, in order to minimize administrative confusion and CFS liability, only sanctioned CFS activities may use the CFS name. CFS activities are intended for CFS members only, unless otherwise stated in a CFS policy or Board resolution.

The Board may, at its discretion, grant exceptions to allow individuals who are not members of CFS to participate in CFS sanctioned activities as non-member participants. This includes allowing non-member participants to fill open slots in activities when needed from private Christian schools with whom CFS has reciprocal agreements to participate in their activities. A current school with a reciprocal agreement is Heritage Christian School because they allow CFS students to participate in baseball and girls soccer. However, league rules take precedence, as well as the other team's stated policy.

Homeschool students who are not members of CFS may be approved to participate in CFS athletic activities for one academic year. If they are interested in participating in CFS activities in future years, their family will be required to join CFS.

The spring Annual Meeting and Opportunity Fair is open to all CFS, their guests, and interested or potential homeschool families. The Winter Family Dance is open to all CFS members and their guests.

Fall Homecoming Dance and Spring Formal are open to CFS high school students. Juniors and seniors may bring a guest. All other participation is intended for CFS members only.

PROCEDURE

To request consideration as a non-member participant, the following steps must be taken: (Note: this application does not apply to spectators at events such as graduation, athletics, or fine arts concerts and events.)

- 1. Parents/legal guardians (hereafter known as the applicants) will complete the Non-member Participation application form on the CFS Website. It is preferred that applications be completed before the athletic season begins. NOTE: it is encouraged to complete the forms early since applicants cannot participate until approved as outlined in this policy.
- 2. Applicants must agree with the current CFS Statement of Faith (SOF) document with no changes.
- 3. The youth waiver of liability form must be filled out on the CFS Website.
- 4. The Athletic Ambassadors of the CFS Board will review the applications for completeness and consult with the sport coordinator as to whether there is a need for an applicant on the team according to the athletic policy.
- 5. Applicants will pay for and authorize a background check for each parent. The amount is subject to change, but in 2025 that amount was \$20/person.
- 6. CFS Administration Ambassadors will order the background checks. Under normal circumstances the background check company says to expect the results within 3-5 business days.
- 7. If the coordinator and/or athletic committee approve of a non-member participant application, the athletic ambassador will present the request to the board for vote and then inform both the sport coordinator and the applicant family of the decision. The criteria to be used by the Board for approval of non-member participants is included in Appendix B. Note: If the applicants are new to CFS and do not have a sponsor listed on their application, the Membership Ambassadors will arrange for an interview prior to the Board vote.
- 8. The applicants will pay the applicable fees charged by the activity which may include additional fees above that required for CFS members.

Every application for an exception shall be prayerfully considered and decided upon in the manner which a majority of the Board believes will best glorify God.

Appendix B

Criteria to Consider for Non-Member Participants

- 1. Is the exception being granted to a non-member in an organization with whom we have a reciprocal agreement?
- 2. Will the granting of the exception diminish the opportunity of CFS students to participate in the sanctioned activity? (For example: Are there already enough CFS members participating in the activity to meet the roster size requirements or will the addition of non-members substantially reduce CFS members participation.)
- 3. Will the granting of an exception allow a group of CFS students to have an experience that they would not otherwise have? (This is commonly used when not enough CFS students have interest in a CFS sanctioned activity to allow CFS to meaningfully participate, such as to field a complete soccer team.
- 4. Will the granting of the exception, or the refusal to grant the exception, be detrimental to the unity and the purpose of CFS?
- 5. Would the granting of the exception contradict any policy, league, or tournament agreements?

Note: The Board may also consider such other issues as it deems necessary, but under no circumstances shall exceptions be granted for the purpose of gaining a competitive advantage.
